

# Leisure & Culture Dundee working in partnership with Dundee City Council

## MANAGEMENT RULES

### For the Regulation of Playing of Golf in Camperdown and Caird Park (Including 9 hole and pitch & putt courses)

**Director of Leisure & Culture Dundee:** The Manager (on behalf of the Director of Leisure & Culture Dundee) of the centre (which shall include any authorised members of his/her staff) shall have general charge and control of the centre. The Manager may require any person considered to have broken any of the Rules to leave the centre and that person shall at once leave and may be refused further admission. Access to the course and all tickets for admission are issued subject to compliance with these Rules.

**Application of the rules:** These Rules extend to the whole of the relevant premises including all structures within the Golf Course.

- 1 No person shall enter on to the course without having first paid for and obtained an appropriate ticket of admission and reported their presence to the Starter.
- 2 Leisure & Culture Dundee shall not be held responsible and does not accept liability for the loss of or damage to property or valuables left in the building or any other part of the course.
- 3 No person shall disobey or ignore any instruction or order given by the Manager or his/her staff in the interests of health and safety.
4. No person shall bring or cause to be brought into the course any unauthorised alcoholic or intoxicating liquor or drugs; enter the relevant premises while under the influence of drink or drugs; smoke in or around the relevant premises; use profane, indecent or offensive language or behave or conduct oneself in an indecent, offensive, insulting, disorderly or violent manner; wilfully damage any article belonging to the Leisure & Culture Dundee or attempt, plan or conspire or do any act likely to wilfully damage the same; bring or cause to be brought into the relevant premises, disobey or ignore any instruction given by the Manager or his/her staff.
5. The etiquette of golf must be observed as approved by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews.
- 6 Play shall take place on those parts of the park set aside for the game of golf.
- 7 The course or courses will be open for play every day between such hours as Leisure & Culture Dundee decide, intimated at a notice placed at the starters' box.
- 8 Leisure & Culture Dundee may for any special purpose, close the course or courses or part thereof to the public for such period as they may from time to time consider necessary. No person shall, during such period enter or play on any part of the course or courses so closed.
- 9 No person shall loiter on the course or courses and no person shall, without the authority of Leisure & Culture Dundee, play any game except golf.
- 10 Dogs are not permitted on the course.
- 11 Before commencing play, every member shall personally obtain a ticket from the starters box and be in receipt of the appropriate ticket and/or Membership card and present to an officer of Leisure & Culture Dundee upon request.
- 12 The course shall be played in regulation, starting at the first tee, with a maximum of eighteen holes (excluding 9 Hole Course and Pitch & Putt) constituting a full round of golf, unless prior authorisation is obtained.
- 12 During busy periods at the course or courses, the representative of Leisure & Culture Dundee shall not consent to any person playing alone (on 18 Hole Courses).

- 13 Tickets and Cards are not transferable. Contravening this regulation could result in the forfeit to the right to play during the remainder of the day. Persistent contravention may result in removal of access to the course or courses.
- 14 It is the golfer's responsibility that no-one is in danger of being struck by a ball. No person shall play a shot until those in the tee and green area out of danger. Leisure & Culture Dundee accept no responsibility for any accident of this type and recommend individual insurance to cover this liability.
- 15 No person who has holed out shall try his putt over again when other players are following.
- 16 No person shall play with less than 3 clubs (one of which must be a putter) in a golf bag (excluding Pitch & Putt) or in a group of more than 4 players.
- 17 Leisure & Culture Dundee may arrange for booking of tee times in advance, restricting the tee times available for general play.
- 18 No person shall enter the golf course with a view to finding golf balls and any person guilty of picking up golf balls shall be dealt with in accordance to Law.
- 19 Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult or be part of an adult supervised group at all times(excluding 9 Hole and Pitch & Putt).
- 20 Players under the age of 16 can play off any designated tee, with the exception of White/medal tees.
- 21 Players must tee off from between the tee markers, on the designated tee which will be displayed at the starters box. Competition/Medal/White tees are reserved and players must receive authorisation to play from these areas.
- 22 Motorised golf buggies are allowed at the discretion of Leisure & Culture Dundee but must keep off all fairways, greens and tees and follow the designated route.
- 23 Leisure & Culture Dundee may provide lockers for the convenience of players. Leisure & Culture Dundee shall not be held in any way responsible for loss or damage to any property placed therein.
- 24 Leisure & Culture Dundee will determine course charges and display them at the course.
- 25 Leisure & Culture Dundee reserve the right to amend or extend these conditions at any time. Such variations will be displayed at the course.
- 26 Threats or acts of aggression could result in the removal of access to the course or courses.
- 27 The Manager may, if he/she has reasonable grounds for believing that a person has contravened, is contravening or is about to contravene any of the foregoing rules, expel or exclude that person from the course. A person who persistently contravenes or attempts to contravene the foregoing rules and is, in the opinion of Leisure & Culture Dundee likely to contravene them again, shall be liable to be made the subject of an exclusion order the length of which will be determined by the Manager/Management of the facilities concerned.
